General Instructions

1. Evaluation will be held in the month of September, December and February/ March.
2. Attendance will be marked on every Parent Teacher Meet and the children should accompany their Parents in School Uniform only.
3. The School Almanac should be checked and counter signed by the Parents regularly.
4. Label all the belongings of your ward with permanent marker.
5. It is mandatory that one cycling shorts should be there in the bag daily.
6. Ensure that the nails of your ward should be trimmed every Sunday as there will be a regular surprise check.
7. Ensure that the hair (for non-sikh children) should be cut when needed (once in a month) as there will be a regular surprise check. For non-sikh boys, crew cut is mandatory.
8. Neatness of notebooks, books and hand writing will be evaluated in each assessment.

9. Birthday celebrations are not allowed in school. So kindly don't send any gifts in the school for the distribution. In order to inculcate the feelings of empathy in their ward, the parents should take them to religious place, orphanage, old age home etc. for extending a helping hand to the deprived ones.
